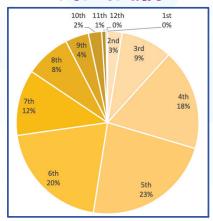

Top successes of 2019! Our day camp participation increased and a new camp focused on teen leadership "Teen Adventure Challenge" became a part of our day camp program. As we took a step back from offering residential overnight camp experiences at the Eastern Nebraska 4-H Center, we were able to offer several chartered buses from Gretna and Grand Island to Halsey. Parents appreciated the chance to send their campers to camp without the burden of transportation. 111 campers utilized the bus transportation. 2019 provided us with many successes!

We employed **20 Camp Counselors** at Nebraska 4-H Camps, representing **5 countries** - United States, Canada, Rwanda, Germany, and United Kingdom. Many of our camp counselors are enrolled in classes that have a direct relationship to youth development including education, recreation, creative arts, environmental sciences and business. While working at camp, these young people gained **real world employment experience** and invaluable leadership, communication, and problem solving skills, all of which helps them become more successful in their future careers.

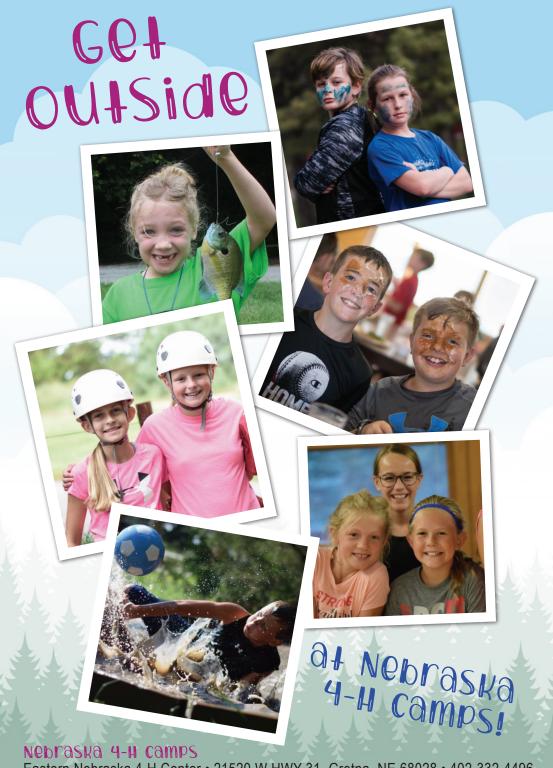
