Lou-Wheeze Smoker's Lungs Comparison Model

The Lou-Wheeze Lungs Comparison Model can be used to demonstrate the differences in appearance and function between a diseased lung and a healthy lung. The latex lung model on the left of the display shows damage done by exposure to cigarette smoke, including emphysema and cancer. In contrast, the model on the right serves as an example of a healthy lung.

Mr. Dip Lip

Mouth open and closes from the rear and flesh-like lips retract to show disease effects of dipping on the inner lip, gums and teeth.

Mr. Gross Mouth

This hinged model of the teeth, tongue, and oral cavity show the effects of using smokeless tobacco. It is three times normal size and is mounted on a wooden base.

A Year's Worth of Tar

This glass jar full of tar represents the amount of tar a smoker puts into their lungs each year when smoking only a half pack of cigarettes a day.
