

Participants will learn multiple aspects of horse care and management as well as hands-on riding sessions. Learn about the UNL Equine programs and opportunities for study and career opportunities in the equine field and campus equine activities that are available for students.

Participants and horses will stay on campus during the camp. All housing and food will be provided for all participants throughout the duration of the camp.

Participants will need to bring all hay, grain, and other supplements for their own horses. You will receive a letter of verification by May 1st with details about what to bring to camp as well as forms that will need to be returned by mail prior to the camp (equine health statement and 4-H registration and health statement form) and a schedule of events.

Sessions will be taught by Libby Lugar, UNL Equine Lecturer and UNL Equestrian Team Coach.

EQUINE SCIENCE OPTION

The Equine Science option at UNL prepares students for successful careers in all aspects of the horse industry. Hands-on experience is provided through riding, training and evaluation courses, while the scientific basis for horse production is explored through specialized courses in nutrition and reproduction.

Course credits are frequently applied towards either the Animal Science major or the Animal Science minor with an equine emphasis and may also be taken as electives by any UNL student.

- Animal science majors can focus their coursework on horses by choosing the new equine science option.
- Students majoring in a degree program other than animal science may choose a minor with an equine emphasis.
- All UNL students, in all majors, can take equine science courses as electives.

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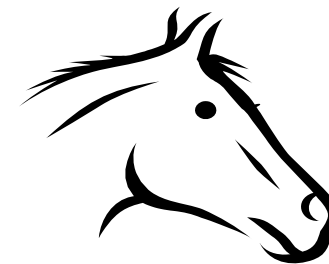

Session 1 June 4 - 7

Participants need to have passed Level 3 of the 4-H Horse Project Advancement Levels (4-H 426) or be proficient in skills equal to Level 3. Limit of 14 participants.

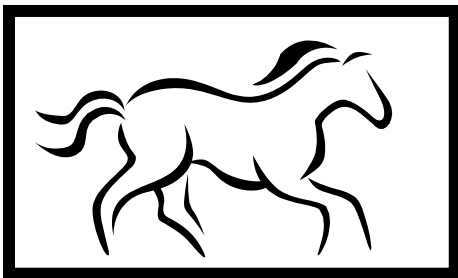
Session 2 June 8 - 11

Participants need to have passed Level 2 of the 4-H Horse Project Advancement Levels (4-H 426) or be proficient in skills equal to Level 2. Limit of 14 participants.

Camp registration fee is \$300. **A \$100 deposit is due with the application form with the balance due after notification.** Those applicants not chosen to participate in the camp will have the deposit fee refunded.

Applications are due by April 28th. Applications will be reviewed, and those accepted to the camp will be notified no later than May 1st.
